From Oct 23 - April 24 - NB IT System only live from Feb 24

427 individual referrals for children.

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All children have been able to 'Tell their story once' and have been supported to access the appropriate advice and support through a range of voluntary and statutory organisations within their community.



WHAT WE ARE ACHIEVING?

90%

reported increase in being able to manage a long term health condition

75%

of CYP and their families feel more supported in their education since accessing the Connected Care Network



63%

improvement in managing day to day mental health needs.

44%

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reduction in feeling socially isolated
